



2nd Conditional Practice

The second conditional is used to express situations that are unlikely to happen or are imaginary. It consists of two clauses:

1. the "if" clause (condition) and
2. "main" clause (result).

Here's the structure:

If + subject + past simple verb, subject + would + base verb.

For example:

If I had a car, I would drive to work.
